



Fiona Sunrise Jasmine

Jasminum officinale 'Fiona Sunrise'

Description:

An outstanding variety producing ferny foliage that emerges yellow, then matures to bright gold all season; fragrant, white star flowers appear in early summer; perfect for training over trellises or walls; tolerates lower light

Features & Attributes

Fiona Sunrise Jasmine is covered in stunning fragrant white star-shaped flowers held atop the branches from mid spring to early fall. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its small ferny pinnately compound leaves emerge yellow, turning gold in color with hints of lime green throughout the year.

This is a dense multi-stemmed evergreen houseplant with a spreading, ground-hugging habit of growth. This plant may benefit from an occasional pruning to look its best.

Planting & Growing

When grown indoors, Fiona Sunrise Jasmine can be expected to grow to be about 12 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 5 feet. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 30 years. This houseplant will do well in a location that gets either direct or indirect sunlight, although it will usually require a more brightly-lit environment than what artificial indoor lighting alone can provide. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It is not particular as to soil type or pH; an average potting soil should work just fine.
